COLOR CODING

myHealthAdvisor color codes hospitals based on their relative performance to other hospitals in the U.S. Color coding is used for both procedure-level scores and hospital composite scores.



Blue = The optimal choice.

Blue represents the top 20% of hospitals.



Green = A good choice.

Green represents hospitals with above average quality.



Yellow = May want to consider additional alternatives. Yellow represents hospitals with below average quality.



Red = Consider other options.

Red represents the bottom 20% of hospitals.

Numerical Scoring

Scores are assigned based on an algorithm that numerically scores the providers. *Numerical* scores range from 30 to 100.

A score of 100 is the highest, representing the top 5% of providers. A score of 30 is the lowest possible score, representing the bottom 5% of providers. The rest are interpolated based on their ranking relative mortality or complication rates.

Use the numerical scores and color coding together to get a full picture of a particular hospital's quality relative to the quality of other hospitals in the U.S.

PROCEDURE RATINGS

Each hospital is rated on various procedure-level specialties using the color and numerical scoring previously described.

When selecting a hospital, you ideally want to choose a hospital that is highly rated for your specific procedure. A good hospital isn't good at everything.

Examples of procedures ranked include appendectomy, C-section delivery, hip replacement, and knee replacement. We currently rank 38 procedures and/or conditions.

COMPOSITE RATINGS


Each hospital is given a *Composite* score that encompasses the quality of the hospital as a whole.

The *Composite* score is based on the hospital's individual procedure scores plus other critical hospital measures such as sepsis (blood poisoning) survival rates.

CENTER OF EXCELLENCE INDICATORS


A hospital is defined as a *Center of Excellence* if it ranks in the top10% for quality for a specific procedure. This is shown by a blue check mark.

Hospitals that have at least one *Center of Excellence* are give the **COE** symbol at the composite level. The number in the box represents how many procedures at that hospital rank in the top 10% for quality.



ASSOCIATED QUALITY PROVIDER

myHealthAdvisor rates physicians based on their specialties and hospital affiliations. If a physician is affiliated with one or more hospitals that have a **COE** in one or more of their specialties, that physician may be designated as an *Associated Quality Provider*, as long as they do not have any malpractice or sanctions against them.
